Based in North Somerset, the ensemble was formed in 1977 as a quintet. The larger Ensemble was formed a short time later to play for one concert. The line-up of 4 trumpets, tenor horn, euphonium, tuba, 3 trombones and percussion was so successful, the group stayed together. A flugelhorn was later added to give more versatility.

Bold Brass players have many years of experience playing in brass bands, jazz and big bands. The standard of playing is to semi-professional standard and the repertoire is drawn from classical, jazz, big band and popular brass band music. Many of our arrangements have been made especially for the group by past and present members and musical directors.

Bold Brass has provided music for the Open University award ceremonies in Torquay, Cheltenham and Milton Keynes for over 15 years and for many years have been an essential part of the Bristol Evening Post Carol concert in the Colston Hall (now organised by BBC Radio Bristol, and is broadcast by them on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day). The group also play at concerts in churches and indoor and outdoor music festivals, as well as visiting Germany, France and Czechoslovakia over the years.
